## **Infection Transmission Incidents**

One inoculation injury occurred in Dec 2022 – sharps injury – team member referred to Occupational Health for bloods. Incident investigated by MReid.

One inoculation injury occurred Sept 2022 – referred to Occupational health no action deemed necessary.

## **Audits**

The IPS HTM 01-05 Audit was completed in February and September, and the following actions taken:

Cupboard fronts in Surg 2 require replacement

DUWL tests were carried out Jan, Feb, April, July, Oct - issue with line in surgery one in Jan - consulted with Kavo and Aura, rectified and Surgeries 1 & 3 now have facility to do a deep disinfection cycle which is carried out regularly and logged in surgery folder - no issues since

A washer disinfector is still not currently viable.

### Risk Assessments

The full practice risk assessment was reviewed by Carol Turner in February and June with no changes noted.

The next risk assessment review will be in February 2023.

Training was carried out on action in event of needlestick injury 15/2/22

Hand hygiene training given 12/5/22
